Henderson Community College offers customized business and industry training courses on the main college campus, the IET building on Pennell Street and the Paul Herron Technology Center in Union County. In the fall of 2008, the Sullivan Technology Center will open on the college campus providing state of the art training facilities. In the past year, HCC served over 106 different companies in the region.



The Career Connections One Stop Center is located on the college campus. In conjunction with the one-stop, the center offers pre-employment assessments, soft skills training and a yearly job fair. The Dean of Community and Economic Development is the one-stop meeting coordinator.

As a part of a 16 college system, HCC has the luxury of having qualified instructors in any area an employer might need. Classes can be delivered anywhere, anytime.

Through the Workforce Investment Network System, grant money is available that will pay for 75% of training costs (the company pays 25% to the college and 10% to the KCTCS system for administrative costs). In the most recent fiscal year, HCC lead the state in the securing of WINS grants!

Henderson Community College along with its business and industry training department can offer on campus college credit classes, business and industry non-credit classes, business and industry credit classes and online credit classes leading to diplomas, certificates, and degrees.
